

HISTORY OF LUTTRELL - BLAINE - CORRYTON UTILITY DISTRICT

LUTTRELL, TENNESSEE

Luttrell - Blaine Utility District was organized on March 17, 1959 by the Honorable Charles H. Kitts, County Judge, of Union County Tennessee with the following Commissioners being appointed: James C. Booker, Thomas J. Vineyard and Roy Wallace.

At the next meeting the following officers were elected: James C. Booker - President, Thomas J. Vineyard - Secretary and Roy Wallace - Treasurer.

March 20, 1959 the Commissioners entered into a contract with Bost Engineering Company and Mr. Howard Collett was retained as attorney for the District.

April 4, 1960 Bost Engineering Company presented a proposal for a water system with an estimated cost of \$ 225,000.00 and requiring a total of 275 customers. after a dilligent effort we found we could not obtain this number of customers.

July 26, 1962 Mr. Doyle M. Davis informed us that Corryton wished to merge with Luttrell - Blaine and become the Luttrell - Blaine - Corryton Utility District. This proposal had been approved by the Corryton Community Club. Mr. Bost was instructed to prepare plans and specifications accordingly.

October 23, 1962 an application for a 50% Grant and Loan in the amount of \$ 687,000.00 was submitted to the H & H F A. We learned the application for loan was approved on June 29, 1963 but no Grant funds were available.

January 28, 1963 the possibility of selling bonds to Francis I. Dupont and Company was discussed but this sale did not materialize.

March 2, 1963 Mr. Howard Collett went before the County Judge of Union County and had the District boundaries extended to include Corryton and to form Luttrell - Blaine - Corryton Utility District with the following Commissioners being appointed: James C. Booker - Union County, Thomas J. (Jimmy) Vineyard - Grainger County and Doyle M. Davis - Knox County. We felt with one Commissioner from each County would be to the best interest of all concerned.

November 12, 1963 an application for a 100% loan was submitted to the H & H F A and the application for Grant and Loan was withdrawn.
